Second Phase of Broadneck Trail

For those fans of the Broadneck Trail, a consultant has been busy with the design of the second section. This portion will stretch from Greenholly Drive to Bay Dale Drive. It has

presented unique challenges with storm water management, grading and the kind of structures to be used in laying out this part of the trail. Due to these concerns, an extension has been granted to complete the design. If all goes well, a “notice to proceed” will be granted in September of this year, with the award of a contract for construction in January of 2017. Monies for this project are through a federal grant to the SHA. As with any undertaking of this magnitude, changes can occur regarding timing. But the Department of Public Works assures us they are diligently working on this!
