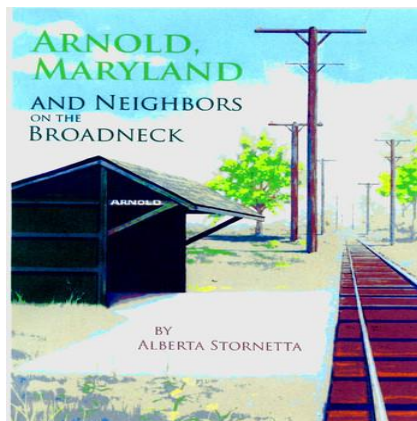

Unfinished Business – A meeting coordinated by APC and the Hogan Companies was held regarding the Hagan Property and the proposal for 51 townhouses vs the originally planned 18 single family homes. A county- required community meeting will be scheduled.

New Business – The County is working with the Board of Education, Department of Public Works and proposed developers along East Joyce Lane to make it a safe route to school, with a 50 foot right of way, curb and sidewalk. A comprehensive plan with a traffic study and corridor study is needed. A funding source is being sought.
