

Anne Arundel County's 65 Gallon Recycling Cart Program Eclipses 100,000 Delivery Milestone

The Anne Arundel County Department of Public Works, Bureau of Waste Management Services recently exceeded 100,000 deliveries of the 65 gallon recycling cart and anticipates meeting the countywide distribution goal by September 2014. The original distribution was scheduled to be complete in December 2014. Customers will receive notice in the mail several weeks prior to distribution in their neighborhood informing them of their specific delivery date. This letter also provides customers the opportunity to accept or decline the cart.

The 65 Gallon Recycling Cart Program began as a pilot program in 2010 with small scale distributions. Results of the pilot program determined that providing customer a more convenient cart with increased capacity would have a positive impact on the curbside recycling rate.
