PLAN 2040

APC encourages our members to comment on the [Preliminary Draft Plan 2040](#) before November 15th. Any additional comments should be sent to Plan2040@aacounty.org. It is scheduled to go before the Planning Advisory Board in mid-December, with another opportunity for public comment in early 2021. It will then go before the County Council for final approval. Immediately following final approval by the County Council will be the start of the Regional Planning Area Plans, order to be determined by the county council. OLD COUNTY ROAD CONSTRUCTION

On Old County Road, several projects have been completed over the last several months to improve the drainage. These included improving the efficiency capacity of closed storm drain systems.

The goal is to capture the water before it crosses the road. This was a safety issue because the water was freezing on the roadway. A total of 5 projects were completed along Old County, costing approximately \$750K. It was performed by contractors for the Bureau of Watershed Protection & Restoration Stormwater Infrastructure Program and paid for by the Stormwater Restoration Fee, as part of the Stormwater Infrastructure Program.





B & A TRAIL IMPROVEMENTS

If your one of those who has recently taken advantage of the B & A Trail through Arnold, you may have noticed some improvements along the way. Recently, three inlets north of Old County Road were retrofitted. This included new rip rap at one, a new filtration system at another, and a new drainage pit at the third. All of these improvements were made by the county department of Recreation & Parks. They are also replacing the broken posts and rails along the trail, most likely knocked over by kids.
